Engaging our citizens in all facets of the community remains the core of our policing philosophy. The Mahoning Township Police Department is committed to delivering the highest level of police services to our citizens and guests.

The men and woman of the Mahoning Township Police Department will continue to embody the Department's Core Values of Integrity, Professionalism, Teamwork, Community, and Duty.

AGENCY PROFILE

Mahoning Township PD was established in October of 1954, with its primary purpose of providing safety for children at the Mahoning Township Consolidated School. Presently, there are seven sworn officers and a full-time civilian who serves in an administrative/clerical function.

The MTPD provides 24/7 primary police services to approximately 5,000 residents, within an 8.6 square mile jurisdiction. Contained within the jurisdiction is Geisinger Medical Center, Geisinger Health Plex, Geisinger Hospital for Advanced Medicine, and Geisinger Children's Hospital. The township population is well over 10,000 people daily due to Geisinger. Collectively, the Geisinger System is boasted to be the largest rural hospital in the world.

Within the ranks of MTPD is a NRA and Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) Certified Firearms Instructors, an NRA certified patrol rifle instructor, an instructor for the police expandable baton, Taser, OC spray, BolaWrap, and G.L.O.V.E. Additionally, a certified instructor for civilian response to active shooters, a police sniper, a certified forensic child abuse interviewer, a PSP trained crime scene technician and photographer, a cellular technology forensic technician, and an officer who is fluent in Mandarin and trained in advanced interrogation techniques.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS

On July 25, 2023, the Pennsylvania Law
Enforcement Accreditation Commission (PLEAC)
awarded the Mahoning Township Police
Department "Accreditation Status". Aside from the
Pennsylvania State Police and the Bloomsburg
University Police Department, Mahoning Township
is the only "accredited" municipal department in
the entire central Susquehanna Valley to include

Columbia, Montour, Northumberland, Union, Snyder, Lycoming, and Clinton Counties.

Only an approximate 15% of the 1100 police departments in Pennsylvania have achieved this honor. The MTPD has been working toward Accreditation for the past few years. It was a long and arduous process for the entire department, especially for Sgt. Matthew Gerst, our Accreditation Manager. He worked with subject matter experts on policies and procedures, as well as with the recent remodel of our department to meet approved standards. The department will be reassessed for accreditation in 2026.





GRANT AWARDS

In 2022 the department applied for two grants through the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) and one grant through Keystone Municipal Insurance Trust (KMIT) during 2022 and received a combined \$175,464 for our department. The grant process through PCCD is difficult to navigate and tedious but it is worth the effort. The department had the support from the Board of Supervisors, then State Representative (now Senator) Lynda Schlegel Culver and then Senator John Gordner's offices, as well as the Montour County District Attorney Angie Mattis.

With the use of the funds, in 2023 the department purchased equipment such as virtual reality training simulator, ballistic shields, riot shields, gas masks, water rescue disks, gear bags, night vision monocular, thermal image monocular, BolaWrap cartridges, external vest carriers, 3D laser scanner for crime scene and accident processing, an indoor Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (drone), a new outdoor drone with thermal imaging and zoom camera capabilities, as well as a 21st parking enforcement software program; all of this at no cost to the taxpayers of Mahoning Township.

Mahoning Township Police Department Recognized for Excellence in Policy and Training



In January of 2023, the Department was recognized for excellence in policy and training for the previous year (2022). *This is the third straight year the department has received this award.* In 2023, Mahoning Township Police Department personnel responded to more than 4950 requests for assistance from criminal investigations, traffic crashes to mental health crisis interventions to motor assists and animal complaints. To maintain a consistent and professional response, the department relies on comprehensive, up-to-date policies.

The Mahoning Township Police Department was recognized by the Lexipol Connect program for achieving Gold level for consistently and effectively disseminating policies to officers, issuing timely policy updates as laws change, and ensuring officers are trained on policies. Lexipol is the nation's leading content, policy, and training platform for public safety agencies; the Connect program tracks Mahoning Township Police Department's performance on five metrics proven to measure success in policy management.

Mahoning Township Police Department's excellence in policy and policy training enhances community safety by ensuring consistent, effective response based on national best practices.

OFFICER HIRED FULL-TIME

Due to the resignation of a full-time officer, Chief Dyroff requested the Board of Supervisors promote part-time Officer George Geise to full-time. On April 10, 2023, Officer Geise began his duties as a full-time officer with the department.

OFFICER PROMOTED TO CORPORAL

On November 11, 2023, Detective Jason Bedisky was promoted to corporal after a competitive process. Cpl. Bedisky will remain the detective for the department, as well as perform supervisory duties as directed by the Chief of Police.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The department participated in the annual Danville Halloween Parade and the National Night Out, as well as the Trunk or Treat event held at Trinity United Methodist Church within the township. Officers made many visits to local daycare centers within and just outside of the township. The department participated in "No Shave November", wherein the officers each paid \$30 to grow a beard. The money raised was matched by the Mahoning Township Police Officer's Association, totaling \$500. The \$500 was donated to a local resident who is battling cancer.

The department continued its Ride Along program where citizens may ride with a patrol officer for a shift to learn an officers duties on a typical day. Several people participated in the program.



COMBINED ENFORCEMENT EFFORTS

The department works hand-in-glove with other Montour County law enforcement agencies daily. On April 27, 2023, Montour County law enforcement consisting of the Danville Police Department, Mahoning Township Police Department, Riverside Police Department (Northumberland County), Montour County Sheriff's Office, Montour County Probation Department, Pennsylvania State Police, and Pennsylvania State Police Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement (LCE), conducted a saturation patrol and warrant service detail in Montour County, with an emphasis on patrolling Danville Borough and Mahoning Township. LCE conducted administrative checks on liquor establishments within Montour County. Montour County Probation officers conducted checks on persons on probation within Montour County, and the Montour County Sheriff's Office served several outstanding warrants. In all, uniformed officers issued 42 traffic citations, 44 warnings, and 1 DUI arrest were made because of this combined effort.

INTERSHIP PROGRAM

TOTAL INCIDENTS

In 2022 the Board of Supervisors approved a college student to participate in a Student Internship with the Department. Currently, the department has one intern, Tenneson Scott, a student at Bloomsburg University, as well as two other interns scheduled for the first 6 months of 2024. Both the student and department gain valuable experiences through the internship program and we look to continue with it well into the future.
