The regular semi-monthly meeting of the Mahoning Township Supervisors was held this evening at the township municipal building at 6:30 P.M.

The minutes of the previous meeting of July 11, 1988 were approved by the board.

Henry Eyer, Jr., Fire Chief representing Rescue Chemical Company requested that a repair bill bepaid from the township Fire Fund for Rescue's 1976 International tanker, which is out of service and needs it's engine rebuilt. Two bids were received, bids included prices both with and without a good core, which will not be known until the engine has been taken apart and sent back to the manufacturer. The first was from Ron's Auto Service in Grovania at \$4,161.36 with a good core, with an additional charge of \$595 if the core is bad. The second from Valley Truck Repair at \$3,962.42 with a good core, with an additional charge of \$600 if the core is bad. Motion was made by Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston to have the work done by the low bidder, Valley Truck Repair, with the stipulation that the core is good.

Betsy Hack and Paula Noll questioned the supervisors as to what could be done to divert storm water run-off from their properties on Jade Avenue and Maple Street. Mr. Hunter informed them that he had seen the problem during heavy storms, and he felt the problem comes from the shoulder being to high. The solution according to Mr. Hunter would be to lower the shoulder and re-contour a neighbor, Mr. Yeager's driveway to allow passage of the water into the catch basin. As it is now the water goes past the catch basin. The supervisors agreed to check with the Yeagers about the possible solution.

Under Old Business, letter was received from Penn Dot stating that they are issuing Permit #W10-033 for the Stop Ahead Warning Devices at S.R. 2010 (Red Lane) for Geisinger Medical Center. They further state in their letter that the devices are in place and are operating correctly. Mr. Hunter stated that two areas need to be corrected, concerning these signs, and he instructed the secretary to send a letter addressing these problems to Walter Shultz of G.M.C. The first problem is an electrical wire coming from one of the signs above the ground.

The second problem is that the signs are not fastened securely. It is the opinion of the supervisors, and has also been indicated by Penn Dot, that the wire should be rerouted underground, and the signs secured in place, so that no hazardous conditions exsist. Motion was made by Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Elmes to draft and send a letter to G.M.C. addressing these issues.

Mr. Young, Zoning Officer, reported that letter was received from Montour County Soil Conservation on the Millwood Subdivision stating that at their meeting on July 18, 1988 they found that the plans for Millwood must have changes made to construction procedure. Once the developer makes the necessary changes, the plans will be submitted to the supervisors for their approval. Mr. Hunter questioned the water run-off from the development, and Mr. Young informed him that the run-off plans are adequate.

Police Chief Donald Hunter, Jr. thanked the board for allowing him to attend the 75th Pennsylvania Police Chief's Conference. He said he found the conference both educational and informative.

Mr. Peters reported that the Deed of Dedication for the streets in Village Gate had been recorded in the court house at the expense of the developer.

Motion was made by Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Elmes to adopt an ordinance restricting parking on the eastern side of Line Street two hundred feet north of the intersection of Bloom Road and Line Street and extending along Line Street a total distance of 133 feet from the point of commencement.

Under new business, letter from House of Representatives member, Robert Flick asked for the supervisors support of two bills up for consideration in September. The first House Bill 1405 would increase liability protection for volunteers and non-profit organizations involved in public service. The second House Bill 802 would guarantee to municipalities and school districts the same liability protection as private landowners when they allow the free use of their land for sports programs, playground activities and other recreational purposes. Motion was made by Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston to send a letter in support of these bills.

Letter came from Ken Smith, along with a signed petition from residents and property owners who have access to the alley between Poplar Street and Pleasant Court, requesting that the township assume responsibility for the maintenance of the alley. Mr. Peters will review the matter for the next regular meeting.

William Sidler, Project Manager for Buchart Horn, Inc.sent a letter to the supervisors dealing with Valley Township Act 537 Plan, which proposes to convey Valley Township wastewater to Danville for treatment, and must pass thru Mahoning Township in order to do so. Attached to their letter was a resolution, which they requested the supervisors sign to assist in insuring implementation of the Plan and assure D.E.R. that all parties are in agreement. Copy of the letter and resolution were given to Attorney Peters for his perusal before the next regular meeting. Copy will also be given to the Mahoning Township Water and Sewer Authority.

The next letter came from Elsie Bandaruk concerning a water run-off problem from the Frosty Valley Country Club on to her property. The supervisors and Zoning Officer will review the problem. Mr. Young has also contacted Tammy Welliver of Montour County Soil Conservation, who will also check into the problem. Mr. Hunter requested that Mr. Young also contact Tom Evans, manager of the Frosty Valley, and report the complaint to him so that he is aware of the situation.

Another letter also came from Cindy Shumaker Kessler of Village Gate concerning a water run-off problem on her property and into her basement. The former owners David and Barbara Mensch had the same problem with water run-off, and Mr. Karr was instructed to install a Type "A" ditch, the ditch has slowly built up to a depth,at its deepest point,of 9 inches, and according to the Village Gate plans the ditch should be $1\frac{1}{2}$ feet. Mr. Hunter requested that a letter be sent to Mr. Karr asking him to have the problem corrected.

Motion was made by Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Elmes to send the police chief to a Crime Prevention seminar in Harrisburg in October.

Mr. Hunter then requested that a letter be sent to the county requesting that they erect stop signs at the intersection of Circle Drive and Woodbine Lane as the traffic flow has become heavier with the growth of new industry.

Resolved, and it is hereby resolved, that after the review of the actuarial reports of the Mahoning Township Police Pension Fund the supervisors agreed that the pension fund is financially sound, and that no officers contributions are required and are hereby waived for 1986, 1987 and 1988.

Motion was made by Mr. Elmes to authorize and approve the checks on bill lists of July 15, 1988 for Payroll and July 25, 1988 for the bills, Mr. Earlston seconded the motion.

Motion was then made to adjourn by Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston.

The minutes of the previous meeting of July 25, 1988 were approved by the board, and the Treasurer's Report reflecting \$19,556.07 in receipts and \$40,817.25 in disbursements for the month of July was accepted by motions of Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Elmes.

Zoning Officer, Nelson Young reported fees collected for July in the amount of \$367.50 at a total value of \$253,000.

Donald Hunter, Jr., Chief of Police read his police report for June and turned in check from District Justice Geiger in the amount of \$1,595.50 for the month of June. He also mentioned that the department continues to have a stalling out problem with the new police car, and it was suggested that the police try various unleaded high octane gasoline to help alleviate the problem.

Letter was received from Walter Shultz of Geisinger assuring the board that the problems with the warning devices on Red Lane have been corrected. Letter was then read from Tom Kiniry of Pennsylvania Power and Light Company requesting that the township convert it's street lights to high pressure sodium lights at no cost to the township. He explained in his letter that the high pressure lights would give 30% more light than our existing system, and would save the township approximately \$200 a year based on current rates. Motion was made by Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston to send a letter approving the conversion.

Another letter was also received from Betsy Hack of the Planning Commission regarding the Millwood Subdivision. Mrs. Hack is concerned with storm water runoff and she questioned the run off calculations, to which Mr. Young explained that the plans are based on a fifty year rainfall, however, the detention basin is based on a one hundred year rainfall, which increases it's storage facility over the normal. The outlet pipe from the detention basin is based on a ten year rainfall. Mr. Young advised further that he would send Mrs. Hack a letter explaining the situation.

Since we have not heard anything as yet from Penn Dot, Mr. Hunter requested that they be contacted to inquire whether they feel permission should be granted to P. P. & L. to install a street light at the intersection of Bald Top Road and Route 11.

Mr. Hunter also reported that at the present time the Street Department employees are working on correcting the various water run-off problems throughout the township.

Under New Business, letter came from State Representative Ted Stuban assuring the supervisors of his support for House Bills 1405 and 802, which the supervisors also support.

Mr. Hunter addressed complaints he has received from several township residents, the first was a request that something be done about all the cats running loose throughout the township. The second request was that something be done about people walking dogs and allowing same to relieve themselves on other peoples lawns. The supervisors decided that at this time a notice should be placed in the paper asking that people be more responsible for their pets.

Motion was made by Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston to authorize and approve checks on checklists of July 29, 1988 for payroll and August 8, 1988 for the bills, also included in his motion was a motion to adjourn.

The minutes of the previous meeting of August 8, 1988 were approved by the board.

Zoning Officer, Nelson Young reported that the Planning Commission had met this evening and approved the Lewis Lee subdivision and transfer of 1.19 acres to Donald T. Gunther. They also approved the change of lot lines on the Hulziser tract, the supervisors also approved both plans.

The minutes of the previous meeting of August 22, 1988 were approved by the board. Treasurer's Report reflecting \$58,724.09 in receipts and \$27,830.38 in disbursements was accepted by motions of Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston.

Zoning Officer's report reflected value of permits issued for August of \$65,150 with a total fees collected of \$98.Mr. Young reported that the Planning Commission had met this evening at 5:30 P.M. and approved the transfer of .69 acres of land from Thomas Herman to Gene Cavanaugh. Transfer was also approved by the supervisors.

Under Old Business, letter was received from State Representative Robert Belfanti, Jr. thanking the board for their concern for House Bills 1405 and 802. Letter also came from DER stating that they had reviewed the planning modules for the Millwood Development, and that they had determined that adequate conveyance and treatment capacityexsists to accommodate the proposal.

Mr. Hunter reported that the new furnace for the township building was delivered today and would, perhaps, be in operation by the end of the week. The board agreed to have the street department remove the trees.

After reviewing the actuarial reports for the police and non-uniform pension plan, which were prepared by the secretary, the board instructed her to submit same to

the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System.

At 6:40 bids were opened for a new 1989 pick-up truck. Two bids were received, the first from Hawkins Chevrolet at \$17,332.73, the second from Metzer Ford at \$17,489. By motion of Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston the bids were taken under advisement to be awarded at a special meeting to be held by the supervisors Thursday, September 15, 1988 at 9 A.M. for the sole purpose of making the final decision on awarding the bids.

At 6:45 bids were opened on a new 1989 Police cruiser. Two bids were received, the first from Metzer Ford at \$14,493. The second from Hawkins Chevrolet at \$14,374.90. By motions of Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston these bids were also taken under advisement to be awarded at the special meeting.

The secretary informed the board of several upcoming seminars sponsored by DCA. Motion was made by Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Elmes to have Mr. Hunter attend the Wetlands Workshop.

The supervisors received a request for their assistance from a number of township residents regarding postal service to rural mailboxes. The area in question is zoned residential single family suburban. One resident, Charles Wagner, after having received detailed instructions from the Danville Post Office for the location and installation of his mailbox, complied, only to receive further instructions that he relocate his mailbox on the opposite side of the street. Mr. Young and Mr. Hunter reviewed the situation and made on site inspections, and feel that the requirements of the postal service are not necessary. The supervisors asked that the secretary draft a letter to Congressman Paul Kanjorski for his assistance with this matter.

Mr. Hunter then reported that he and Mr. Earlston met on Friday, September 9, 1988 at 10:30 A.M. with Mr. Leutze of Penn Dot to discuss the traffic operations at the intersection of Bloom Road and Academy Avenue. At this time, it was felt the incidents occurring at the intersection should be recorded and that the problem should be closely monitored.

Mction was made by Mr. Elmes to authorized and approve the checks on the bill lists of August 26th and September 9, 1988 for payroll and September 12, 1988 for the bills, also included in his motion was a motion to adjourn, Mr. Earlston seconded.

The bids received from Hawkins Chevrolet and Metzer Ford for both the 1989 police cruiser and the 1989 pick-up truck were thoroughly gone over by the board.

The minutes of the previous meeting of September 12, 1988 were approved by the board.

Donald Hunter, Jr. gave his August police report, and turned in report from the District Magistrate in the amount of \$470.

Zoning Officer, Nelson Young reported that he had received a complaint about vehicles being abandoned at a property along Toby Run. He requested permission to write the owner of the property, who lives in Feasterville, Pennsylvania, and request that he have the vehicles removed, the supervisors agreed to have a letter sent to the property owner. Mr. Young also requested that the supervisors allow him to close his office on Tuesday morning due to a death in his family, to which the supervisors also agreed.

Mr. Young then informed the board that the Montour County Commissioners plan to tear down and rebuild the County Home on Woodbine Lane, which would require a building permit, however, he requested that the permit fee be waived for the County, and by motions of Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Hunter the permit fees were waived.

Letter came from Congressman Paul Kanjorski in reply to our letter to him concerning the postal problem some of our residents are experiencing. He states that he has sent appropriate correspondence to the proper official at the Postal Service to call attention to this matter, and is waiting for a response to his inquiry.

At the same time, correspondence came from Senator Arlen Spector's office on the same matter. Senator Spector's office received a reply from the Danville Postmaster, Robert C. Roberts, stating that the Danville Post Office is complying with the Postal Regulations (copy of which was attached), and for economy and safety of the carrier, they will be making only one circle in the respective area, and will be serving any and all boxes that are located on the carrier's line of travel. The letter further stated that the supervisors did not consult

with the management of the Danville Post Office as to why this change had become necessary, to which the supervisors took exception to, as they, and Nelson Young, as liason, had made several attempts to consult with the Post Office, but received a negative response. Mr. Hunter requested the secretary draft a letter to that effect to both Mr. Roberts, Postmaster, and Senator Spector.

Under Old Business, Mr. Peters reported that he had received, from Timber-wood's attorney, George Wagner, one draft of one section of roadway in the Timberwood Development, to be deeded over to the township, however, he is waiting for the draft of the other section to be prepared, when that has been received, same will be presented to the supervisors for their approval.

By motions of Mr. Earlston, and Mr. Hunter that supervisors passed a resolution dealing with the Update of Act 537 Plan, Valley Township, which recommends construction of a wastewater collection system and interceptor to the Waste Water Treatment Plant of the Borough of Danville. The resolution approves Valley Township locating certain sections of their proposed wastewater interceptor across lands of Mahoning Township, and approves the township submitting the report to the Department of Environmental Resources, subject to all matters being mutually resolved between Valley Township, Mahoning Township and the Borough of Danville, and being set forth in an intermunicipal agreement. It further states that said intermunicipal agreementmust be executed by all parties prior to Valley Township being permitted to construct the said interceptor.

By motions of Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Hunter, the supervisors instructed Mr. Peters to advertise with intent to adopt at their next regular meeting, an ordinance establishing a stop intersection at the intersection of Lower and Middle Streets.

Tom Mertz of the Mahoning Township Water & Sewer Authority requested that Section 603, page 29, of the Mahoning Township Land Subdivision Ordinance, dealing with water and sewer systems, be changed, so that both sections on water and sewer read exactly the same. He said that it is the request of the Authority, on the advice of their solicitor, that the change be made. Mr. Young said that the change could be done by resolution, and the supervisors requested that Mr. Peters review the entire ordinance for any other changes that may also be necessary.

Under New Business, seminar sponsored by Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors and the Department of Community Affairs, will be held October 17, 1988 in Carlisle, PA, Mr. Hunter may attend this Roadmaster's Workshop.

Mr. Earlston reported that bids were received on a bar light for the new police car. The low bidder was Pennsylvania Emergency Supply at \$1,165.00 and motion was made by Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Hunter to purchase the light from same.

Mr. Hunter reported that at present the Street Department are installing a sewer line, and when that is completed, they will start their tar and chip program, which will run for several weeks.

Motion was made by Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Hunter to authorize and approve checks on the bill lists of September 23, 1988 for payroll and September 26, 1988

The minutes of the previous meeting of October 10, 1988 were approved by the board.

Under correspondence letter came from Montour County Commissioners thanking the supervisors and Nelson Young for waiving the building permit fee and for being so accommodating to them during the rebuilding process of the County Home.

Letter was also received from the United States Postal Service addressed to Congressman Paul Kanjorski, the letter basically states that in accordance with their delivery regulations, rural mail receptacles must be placed on the right hand side of the road in the carriers line of travel, so that they may be safely and conveniently served by the carriers without leaving their vehicles.

Letter also came from John Birth, Secretary of the Montour County Township Officials Association, informing the board of the upcoming convention to be held at the Montour-DeLong fair building, November 15, 1988 at 6:00 P.M. Motion was made by Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston to take out a $\frac{1}{2}$ page ad in the convention booklet, as has been done in past years.

Motion was made by Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston that anyone who wishes to attend a DCA sponsored seminar on Dealing with the Angry Public, be able to attend.

In the absence of Police Chief Hunter, the secretary read the September police report and turned in report from District Justice Geiger in the amount of \$1,797.50.

Under Old Business, Mr. Peters informed the board that the two streets in Village Gate, Wodenshire and Cotswold, had been turned over to Penn Dot, were processed and will be listed with the other streets in the township for liquid fuel purposes.

Mr. Peters then read a commitment letter he received from the solicitor of Liberty Township, Robert Buehner, stating that the Liberty Township Supervisors will share in the cost of a survey, to be done by Peter Uhl, to define the line between Liberty & Mahoning Township.

Mr. Peters explained to the board that he had received the surveys on two tracts

of roadway for the Timberwood Development, however, there is a discrepancy in the survey, and he needs more time to go over same before the Deeds of Dedication can be presented to the supervisors.

On a request that came several meetings earlier, that the supervisors maintain the alley between Poplar and Pleasant Streets, Mr. Peters informed the board that only four property owners and one tenant adjoining the alley, signed the petition, five other property owners, also adjoin the alley, and he feels that consent should also come from those property owners.

The supervisors gave their approval for Mrs. Fracalossi to serve coffee at the town-ship municipal building on election day to benefit the library, she is aware of the rule that she must be ten (10) feet away from the polling place.

Mr. Hunter reported that Road Inspection was held Saturday, October 22, 1988, and that the findings during inspection will effect the work to be done by the Street Department come spring. He also said that the new furnace has been installed at the township building and is working well.

Mr. Hunter then informed the board that he had been contacted by Cindy Shuman (Kessler), who said that she is still experiencing water run-off problems at her property in Village Gate. Mr. Karr has been previously contacted by the supervisors and asked to install a swale, which is part of the original soil control and sedimentation plan, however, he has not done this, and as the developer is responsib for his development.

A problem was brought to the attention of the board with parking at the Mahoning Cooper Elementary School during school activities. Neighbors are upset as vehicles are parked illegally along Meadow Avenue, sometimes blocking one lane of travel and private driveways. Mr. Hunter said that he feels the school administration should provide off street parking.

By motion of Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Elmes it was decided that 20% of the liquid fuels money would be used to help pay for the new street department truck.

Budget meeting was set for November 2, 1988 at 9:00 A.M.

Request came from the owner of a business on Reedy Street that the supervisors propose an ordinance excluding tractor trailer combinations from using Reedy Street as they cause damage to the street. Mr. Peters said that tractor trailers are usually restricted by weight, and he would look into same, and would prepare something for the next regular meeting.

Request came from Mahoning Township Authority to have the supervisors enforce an ordinance stating that any township resident that is within 150 feet of a sewer hook up, must hook on to the sewer system. It is the responsibility of the township to enforce the existing ordinance.

Motion was made to authorize and approve checks on the bill lists of October 21, 1988 for payroll and October 24, 1988 for the bills, and also to adjourn, motion

The minutes of the previous meeting of October 24, 1988 were approved by the board, and the Treasurer's Report for October 1988 reflecting \$ 37,793.32in receipts and \$55,330.19 in disbursements was accepted by motions of Mr. Elmes, seconded by Mr. Earlston.

Mr. Young's Zoning Report for October 1988 reflected total value of permits issued of \$411,890 and fees collected of \$717.50. He reported that the Planning Commission had met November 7, 1988 and approved lot line changes on the Millwood subdivision, the supervisors also approved the changes. Planning Commission also met this evening on Mahoning Terrace Apartment & Shopping Center Complex, however, no soil eroision and sediment control plan was available. They did however, accept the transfer of a tract of land from Randy May to Mahoning Township Municipal Authority. Approval was given tentatively until a complete review of the plan could be done by the township zoning officer.

Under Old Business, Mr. Elmes mentioned that the township's annual leaf collection will end this Friday, November 18, 1988.

Letters came from the Thomas Beaver Free Library, thanking the township supervisors for their \$150 donation, from Karen Miller, Secretary of Community Affairs, thanking the supervisors for their resolution in support of timely enactment of Comprehensive Local Tax Reform in Pennsylvania, and from Timothy Karr, Developer of the Village Gate sub-division, stating that he plans to do nothing as far as the water run-off problem some residents of Village Gate are experiencing, this letter was tabled until the supervisors have had time to study same.

Peter Uhl, Registered Surveyor, submitted his letter to Township Solicitor, Arthur Peters, stating that the cost for the research and survey work on the Liberty/Mahoning Township line, shall not exceed \$3,000.

Under New Business, letter was received from Mahoning Township Fire Board outlining their budget needs for 1989, they have requested raising the fire protection tax

from two to three mills, with the extra revenue being divided equally between the township's two fire stations, and held in the township's fire vehicle replacement account. Their letter will be reviewed at the upcoming budget meeting.

Alert Notice came from the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors urging townships to take action on Planning Code Bill 535. The bill would greatly impede township officials' future ability to plan for the growth of their communities.

Lycoming County Landfill submitted their new rates and operating schedule for 1989.

Workshop is being offered by the Department of Community Affairs on Road Maintenance: Liability and Signs. The seminar will be held in South Williamsport December 9, 1988 from 8:30 to 11:45 for anyone who wishes to attend.

Special budget meeting will be held Thursday, November 17, 1988 at 9 AM.

Mr. Hunter reported that he had received a request from Seda-Cog that they conduct a heat survey on the township building at no cost to the township, by motions of Mr. Earlston, seconded by Mr. Elmes, the supervisors agreed to have the survey done.

The next regular meeting for the township supervisors has been changed to November 22, 1988 at 6:30 PM.

Donald Hunter, Jr. explained that he had received a request to have "Slow Children Playing " signs erected or that something be done to slow down the traffic on Reedy Street. The supervisors will take the request under consideration.

To prevent unneeded legal complications, it is vital that building permit officers do not issue building permits until proof of a sewage permit is shown by the applicant. Mr. Young informed the board that this is already being done in our township.

Montour County Conservation District will hold a multi-agency work session, Wednesday, February 22, 1989 from 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 Noon at the Montour County Court House, Danville, Pennsylvania. Mr. Hunter, Mr. Earlston, and Mr. Young plan to attend.

Zoning Dfficer's January report reflected \$945 in fees collected at a total value of permits issued of \$390,000. The fees collected for the month also includes the garbage collection permits for 1989. Mr. Peters opened the meeting by reading the legal notice, and turned the meeting over to the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, Donald Hunter, Sr. Mr. Hunter gave the floor to Robert Davies, Vice President of Facilities Administration for Geisinger Systems Services.

Mr. Davies, who presented Geisinger's future extension plans to the audience, said that at present Geisinger wants to erect a one-story structure to house their computer on one of the parcels of land near Red Lane, however, at present they have no immediate plans for

construction on any of the other parcels.

Mr. Young of the Planning Commission questioned as to whether or not Geisinger would extend Jade Street to meet Red Lane, as was called for in the original plans for that area, however, Mr. Davies said that Geisinger had no intention of doing same.

Jim Barbarich, Millwood Developer, said that he was concerned with land being lost for residential development, and the loss of tax dollars, to which Mr. Davies explained that Geisinger has not taken any properties off the tax rolls.

Rebuttal came from Mike Katerman, who took the floor, submitted photographs taken from Red Lane, and stated that he is concerned with what is happening to the Red Lane area: first, that it may loose it's residential characterists, which was illustrated by the photographs submitted, and second, with the speed of vehicles coming from the parking lot on to Red Lane. He feels that Geisinger's intentions are good, but is concerned with what may happen in the future if their request is granted. Other neighbors reflected that same concerns as the Katermans, as far as not knowing what Geisinger would do with the other parcels of land in the future.

Dr. Brown then called the Planning Commission's meeting to order, and asked for their comments or recommendations on the matter. Mr. Connelley stated that he is concerned with the interests of the area's residents. He feels that the economic backround and expansion of the township can be attributed to Geisinger, and that as long as measures to preserve the interests of the area's residents were taken, he would agree with Geisinger's request.

Mr. Peters suggested that the Planning Commission, Board of Supervisors, and Geisinger work together to come up with acceptable guidelines to this amendment, at which time another public hearing would be held on this matter.

The supervisors hope that this will correct the problem, however, if it does not, they might have to consider adopting an ordinance to alleviate same.

The supervisors gave Police Chief, Donald Hunter, Jr. permission to attend this year's Police Chief's Convention, Mr. Earlston motioned, and Mr. Woodruff seconded the motion.

Mr. Earlston motioned to authorize and approve checks and bill lists of May 5, 1989 for payroll, May 8, 1989 for the bills and to adjourn, Mr. Woodruff seconded.

The minutes of the previous meeting of July 10, 1989 were approved by the board.

Dr. James Curtis from the board of the Thomas Beaver Free Library accepted a donation for the library from the supervisors of \$1,000, however, there was a discrepancy as to the amount that was donated. Dr. Curtis was expecting \$1,500, the 1989 budget shows \$1,000 set aside for the library. The minutes from the meeting last year, when the supervisors pledged the donation will be examined to determine what amount was actually pledged. Further, Dr. Eurtis thanked the board for their support and requested that they also consider the librar in their 1990 budget.

Nelson Young, Zoning Officer asked the supervisors to consider rejustating their performance bond policy, which would require a developer to deposit into an escrow account held by the township, before obtaining timal approval of a plan. Mr. Earlston motioned and policy.

bonald Hunter, dr. read his police report for dime, and turned in monies for June from District Justice Geiger totalling 42,463.55. He arso thanked the board for allowing him to attend the 1989 Police Chief's Convention, which he found to be very interesting and informative.

DED BUSINESS: In Earlston motioned and Mr. woodruft seconded to advertise to bids on a used grader for the township roadcrew, bids to be opened at the next regular meeting.

Mr. Peters reported to the board that he has taken under advisement and is currently working with the authority's engineer on the request from the Mahoning Township Authority that the supervisors ban drilling wells for heat pumps. He stated that other municipalities issue permits for any wells being drilled for record keeping purposes. The Mahoning Township Authority board members are concerned with certain types of heat pumps, which may pollute the Aqua Field.
